### FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS, DIRECTIVE PRINCIPLES OF STATE POLICY AND

**HUMAN RIGHTS: ISSUES AND CHALLENGES** 

CONCEPT NOTE

Constitution of India as a social document is the supreme law of land in India which upholds and guarantees the fundamental rights and human rights of every individual. The preamble, the Fundamental Rights, Human Rights and the Directive Principles constitute the most striking features of our Constitution. The Directive Principals of the State Policy (DPSP) is basically enshrined in Part IV and the Fundamental Rights including human rights such as right relating to life, liberty, equality and dignity has been guaranteed and enforceable in Part III of the Constitution of India. Additionally, the constitutional also imposes certain duties on citizens such as the duty to uphold the constitution, to safeguards public property and to abjure violence, develop humanism, preserve composite culture and protect natural environment, provide opportunity for education etc. Despite the constitutional schemes, India faces several challenges, issues, socio-legal-economic and cultural problem related to human rights, fundamental rights and its duties with implementation of DPSP. The challenges are varied in facet and ranging from social issues to economic complex issues, such as effectiveness of the criminal justice system and its implementation and lack of accountability.

Though Fundamental Rights, Human Rights and DPSP emerge as separate unit in the Constitution, but through the prism of constitutionalism and human rights jurisprudence, it has been observed that their exist no distinction in between them. The intention of chief architect of Constitution Framers in framing our constitution such as Dr. B.N. Rau and Dr. B. R. Ambedkar talks about the harmonious construction and judiciary interpretation by Justice P. N. Bhagawati had always talked about the significance, coherence and interrelation between Fundamental Right including Human Rights and Directive Principles of State Policy. Relation between Fundamental Rights including Human Rights and DPSP is unified in nature and is an vital part of our basic structure doctrine which is now celebrating its 50 years of it canon. It can rightly be stated that both are complementary and supplementary to each other. Thus, in the era of new media age and globalization with expanding technology, the enforcement or implementation of Directive Principles of State Policy vis-à-vis fundamental rights including human rights is no longer remain a mere moral obligation of the state. Hence the present seminar is basically meant to discuss and explore the aforesaid matter and issues and challenges and judicial and institutional approach on the relation between Fundamental Rights, Human Rights and DPSP and the role of the state in its implementation through socio-legal study. The themes of the student seminar reflects the constitutional morality, fundamental values and human rights with principles enshrined in the Indian Constitution, which guarantees the protection of individual fundamental rights, obligation of state under DPSP and duties of citizens towards nation

Overall, the present student seminar is chiefly aims to provide a holistic platform for the college and school students to critically analyze, develop spirit of inquiry and scientific temper, discuss, debate and deliberate with concrete suggestions on contemporary critical issues related to the fundamental rights, human rights and DPSP in India. It will also explore new ideas in implementing the fundamental rights and DPSP and have new insight in various dimensions of the same through judicial interpretation. The student seminar outcome is expected to contribute to the current academic discourse on the above issues and provide socio-legal insights for policymakers and other stakeholders to make or amend new laws for protecting and securing the rights of every individual through affirmative action of state with providing opportunity of efficient mechanism for ensuring social justice to all under the present criminal justice system.

- 1. Abstracts for original research papers on the abovementioned sub themes are invited, which is to be written in MS word, and to be submitted as attachment through email containing covering letter which is to be typed in the body of the mail encompassing the name of the author, course and institution details of the author(s), email ID, Contact number, and Title of Abstract.
- 2.Guidelines for Abstract Writing: Abstract in between 300 to 350 words must be made in MS Word Format (doc)/(docx) in A4 size paper with Font: Times New Roman , Text Font size 10, 1.0 Line spacing, Justify Alignment with italic style. It is directed to mention the title of the paper in capital and bold letter with mentioning the 05 keys words in your abstract. It is strictly directed to the students to not specify or mention your names/course/institution in the abstract.
- 3. Abstract Submission: Submission of the abstract as an attachment in a word file shall be made by sending an e-mail at iilscobseminar2023@gmail.com. The subject line of your message in the email should read as: 'Abstract Submission for Student Seminar on "Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles of State Policy and Human Rights in India: Issues And Challenges"
- 4.There can be a maximum of two Authors only for each Abstract/Paper.
- 5. Authors of shortlisted abstracts shall be required to send their full-length papers who would have the privilege of presenting their papers at this student seminar.
- 6.Full-length research papers in the form of articles within 3500 5000 words (inclusive of footnotes), with abstract of not more than 300 words along with 05 keywords should be sent at email ID iilscobseminar2023@gmail.com.
- 7. Full paper submissions must be made in MS Word Format (doc)/(docx) in A4 size paper with Times New Roman font (Main text: size 12 and 1.5 spacing, Justify Alignment; footnotes: size 10 and single-spaced, Footnote Citation Style: Apply ILI Citation Style). Headings are to be in all caps and subheadings in title case.
- 8. Potential contributors are required to adhere to ILI Citation Style for footnoting work.
