### **Moot Proposition 1 (Roll Number 1-12)**

#### **Background Story**

The State of **Dakshin Pradesh**, a prosperous state in the Republic of Indica, has a strong agrarian economy and a history of regional identity movements. For the last two decades, it has been governed by the **Lok Shakti Party (LSP)**, which often finds itself at odds with the ruling **National Unity Party (NUP)** at the Union level.

In 2025, the Dakshin Pradesh Legislative Assembly passed the **Dakshin Pradesh Agricultural Marketing and Farmers' Protection Bill, 2025**. The Bill sought to create **state-level agricultural trade boards** with exclusive power to regulate procurement, pricing, and licensing of agricultural produce within the state. It also **prohibited private corporations registered outside the state** from directly purchasing produce from farmers, unless specifically licensed by the state boards.

The State Government argued that the Bill was aimed at **protecting local farmers** from corporate exploitation and ensuring fair pricing.

The Bill was passed with overwhelming majority in the Assembly and sent to the **Governor, Shri Aditya Varma**, for assent under Article 200 of the Constitution of Indica.

#### **Events and Dialogues**

When the Bill reached the Governor's desk, he held a press conference:

**Governor Aditya Varma:** "This Bill contradicts the national agricultural reform policies initiated by the Union Government. It restricts free trade and violates the spirit of 'One Nation, One Market'. I cannot, in good conscience, give my assent to it."

The Chief Minister of Dakshin Pradesh, **Smt. Ananya Rao**, responded angrily in the Assembly:

**CM Ananya Rao:** "The Governor is bound by the advice of the elected Council of Ministers. He cannot impose the Union Government's will upon the people of Dakshin Pradesh. This is a direct assault on federalism."

The Governor neither assented to the Bill, nor reserved it for the consideration of the President, nor returned it with recommendations. Instead, he simply **withheld assent indefinitely**, effectively blocking the Bill.

#### **Escalation of Conflict**

The LSP Government filed a petition before the **Supreme Court of Indica under Article 32**, alleging that the Governor's action:

1. **Violated Article 163**, which makes the Governor bound by the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers (except in matters where he is required to act in his discretion).
2. **Destroyed the federal balance** by converting the Governor into an agent of the Union Government.
3. **Violated democratic principles** since an unelected constitutional authority had nullified the will of the elected State Assembly.

The Union of Indica, supporting the Governor, argued that:

- The Governor was within his powers under **Article 200** to withhold assent if a Bill contradicted Union policies.
- Agriculture being an item in the **Concurrent List**, the State Legislature could not override Union reform policies.
- The Governor's role is not purely ceremonial, and he has discretion in matters affecting national policy.

#### **Facts in Issue**

1. The **Dakshin Pradesh Agricultural Marketing and Farmers' Protection Bill, 2025** was duly passed by the State Assembly.
2. The Governor **withheld assent indefinitely**, without reserving the Bill for the President's consideration or returning it to the Assembly.
3. The State Government claims this amounts to **constitutional deadlock** and an **attack on the principles of federalism and representative democracy**.

#### **Arguments of the Petitioner (State Government of Dakshin Pradesh)**

- **Article 163** makes it clear that the Governor is bound by the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers in all matters except where the Constitution expressly gives discretion.
- **Article 200** does not empower the Governor to withhold assent indefinitely; he must either give assent, return the Bill, or reserve it for the President.
- The Governor's action undermines the principle of **federalism**, which is a part of the **basic structure** of the Constitution.
- An unelected Governor cannot veto the democratic will of the elected Assembly.

#### **Arguments of the Respondent (Union of Indica / Governor)**

- The Governor has discretion under **Article 200** when a Bill conflicts with Union policies or national interest.

- Agriculture falls under the **Concurrent List**, and State laws inconsistent with Union reforms must yield under **Article 254**.
- The Governor, as a constitutional authority, is not merely a rubber stamp; he must ensure that laws are in harmony with the national interest.
- The Bill's exclusion of corporations outside the state violates the principle of **free trade under Article 301** of the Constitution.

### Issues for Adjudication

1. **Whether the Governor is bound by the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers in giving assent to a State Bill under Article 200.**
2. **Whether indefinite withholding of assent by the Governor is constitutionally permissible.**
3. **Whether the Governor, in refusing assent, acted in violation of the principles of federalism, democracy, and the basic structure of the Constitution.**
4. **Whether the Dakshin Pradesh Agricultural Marketing and Farmers' Protection Bill, 2025, is unconstitutional for violating Union policies and the freedom of trade under Article 301.**

### Jurisdiction

- The matter is filed directly before the **Supreme Court of Indica under Article 32**, invoking the violation of fundamental rights of the people of Dakshin Pradesh to equality and democratic governance.

### Moot Proposition 2 (Roll Number 13-24)

#### Background Story

The Republic of **Indica** has long debated the idea of a **Uniform Civil Code (UCC)**. In 2026, the Union Parliament passed the **Uniform Civil Code Act, 2026**, aiming to replace diverse personal laws relating to marriage, divorce, inheritance, adoption, and succession with one uniform set of rules applicable to all citizens irrespective of religion.

The Union Government justified this move as a step towards **gender justice, equality, and national integration**, relying heavily on Article 44 of the Directive Principles of State Policy, which directs the State to secure a Uniform Civil Code for its citizens.

However, the law was immediately met with strong opposition from several communities. The **All Faiths Protection Council (AFPC)**, an umbrella body representing members of multiple religious groups including Hindus, Muslims, Christians, and Parsis, filed a writ petition before the Supreme Court of Indica challenging the constitutionality of the Act.

## Events and Dialogues

At a rally in New Delhi, the Union Law Minister declared:

**Law Minister:** “The Uniform Civil Code is not an attack on religion; it is a guarantee of equality. No woman should suffer unequal treatment just because of the faith she was born into.”

Meanwhile, in Dakka City, the headquarters of the AFPC, a prominent religious leader addressed the media:

**AFPC President:** “This Code strips away centuries of religious freedom. Article 25 guarantees us the right to freely profess, practice, and propagate our religion. How can the State dictate whom we marry, how we divorce, or how we inherit property?”

In Parliament, the opposition leader raised concerns:

**Opposition Leader:** “While equality is desirable, can equality be achieved by erasing cultural diversity? India thrives on pluralism. Imposing uniformity risks alienating minorities.”

## Provisions of the UCC Act, 2026

1. **Marriage & Divorce:** All marriages, irrespective of religion, must be registered under civil law. Grounds for divorce are uniform (e.g., cruelty, desertion, adultery). Practices such as *triple talaq*, *anuloma-pratiloma restrictions*, and *canon law annulments* are abolished.
2. **Inheritance & Succession:** Equal rights are granted to sons and daughters in ancestral and self-acquired property across all communities. Special rights of Hindu Undivided Families (HUF) under Mitakshara law are abolished.
3. **Adoption & Guardianship:** All citizens, irrespective of religion, can adopt under a single secular framework. The concept of guardianship is replaced by “parental responsibility.”

## Facts in Issue

1. The **AFPC petitioners** argue that the UCC Act directly violates their religious freedom under **Articles 25–28**.
2. They contend that personal laws are an essential part of religious practice, and uniformity undermines religious identity.
3. The Union argues that the Act is consistent with **Article 44 (DPSP)**, promotes gender equality, and upholds the principle of secularism, which is part of the **basic structure**.

## Arguments of the Petitioners (AFPC / Religious Communities)

- **Violation of Articles 25 & 26:** Personal laws are protected as essential practices of religion. Marriage, divorce, and inheritance are integral to faith traditions.
- **Secularism means pluralism, not uniformity:** The Indian model of secularism is not about erasing differences but about respecting diversity.
- **Basic Structure Violation:** By imposing uniformity, the Act undermines the multicultural and pluralistic fabric of the Constitution.
- **No mandate from the people:** Personal laws were protected at the time of independence, and their sudden abolition without consultation violates democratic legitimacy.

### **Arguments of the Respondents (Union of Indica)**

- **Equality over custom:** Practices like denial of inheritance to daughters, polygamy, and unequal divorce provisions are discriminatory. Article 14 mandates equality.
- **Directive Principles:** Article 44 explicitly directs the State to implement a UCC. Though not enforceable, it provides guidance for legislative action.
- **Essential practices test:** Not all customs are essential to religion. Many personal law practices are social rather than religious in nature.
- **Secularism as basic structure:** A truly secular State cannot allow religious law to override fundamental rights. UCC enhances secularism by giving all citizens one common law.

### **Issues for Adjudication**

1. **Whether personal laws fall within the protection of religious freedom under Articles 25 and 26.**
2. **Whether the Uniform Civil Code Act, 2026 violates the fundamental right to freedom of religion.**
3. **Whether the State, in enacting the UCC, has correctly balanced Fundamental Rights with Directive Principles (particularly Article 44).**
4. **Whether gender equality and secularism as part of the basic structure justify limiting religious practices in personal law.**

### **Jurisdiction**

- The matter is filed before the **Supreme Court of Indica under Article 32**, seeking enforcement of fundamental rights under Articles 25–28.

### **Moot Proposition 3 (Roll Number 25-36)**

## Background Story

The State of **Uttar Desh**, one of the most politically volatile states in the Republic of Indica, has a 300-member Legislative Assembly. In the 2022 elections, the **Jan Lok Party (JLP)** secured a comfortable majority with 165 seats, while the **National Unity Party (NUP)** and smaller parties sat in opposition.

By mid-2025, the ruling JLP faced internal rebellion due to allegations of corruption against the Chief Minister, **Shri Karan Singh Verma**. Nearly 40 MLAs withdrew support and began negotiations with the opposition.

Sensing political instability, the Governor of Uttar Desh, **Shri Rajeev Malhotra**, submitted a report to the Union Government under **Article 356**, claiming that the State Government could not be carried on in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution.

Within 24 hours, the President of Indica proclaimed **President's Rule in Uttar Desh**, dissolving the Legislative Assembly and assuming all executive functions.

## Events and Dialogues

At a press briefing in New Delhi, the Union Home Minister stated:

**Home Minister:** "Law and order has collapsed in Uttar Desh. The Chief Minister has lost the confidence of the House, and corruption has paralyzed governance. The Governor's report makes it clear that the State cannot function within constitutional limits. President's Rule was inevitable."

In Lucknow, the ousted Chief Minister held a press conference:

**CM Karan Singh Verma:** "This is nothing but political vendetta! I was never given an opportunity to prove my majority on the Assembly floor. Article 356 is being misused to topple a democratically elected government. The people of Uttar Desh are watching this assault on federalism."

Opposition leaders welcomed the move, claiming that the JLP government had indeed lost legitimacy.

## Facts in Issue

1. The Governor submitted a report alleging constitutional breakdown in Uttar Desh.
2. The President immediately issued a **Proclamation under Article 356**, dismissing the State Government and dissolving the Assembly.
3. The JLP and its ousted Chief Minister filed a petition in the **Supreme Court under Article 32**, challenging the proclamation as unconstitutional.

## Arguments of the Petitioners (JLP / Former CM Karan Singh Verma)

- **Floor Test Principle:** As held in **S.R. Bommai v. Union of India**, the Governor must allow a floor test before concluding that a government has lost majority. Failure to do so makes the proclamation unconstitutional.
- **Federalism as Basic Structure:** Article 356 cannot be misused to impose Union dominance over States. Arbitrary use violates the federal balance.
- **Political Malice:** The report of the Governor was politically motivated and not based on objective material.
- **Democratic Mandate:** Dissolution of an elected Assembly without giving it a chance to prove its strength violates the democratic will of the people.

#### **Arguments of the Respondents (Union of India / Governor)**

- **Governor's Report is Conclusive:** Article 356 allows the President to act on the Governor's satisfaction. Once the Governor finds that the State cannot function constitutionally, the Union is bound to act.
- **Loss of Confidence:** With 40 MLAs defecting, the government was clearly in minority. A floor test would have been futile.
- **Corruption & Breakdown:** Large-scale corruption and law-and-order failure amounted to "failure of constitutional machinery."
- **Judicial Restraint:** Courts cannot interfere with the President's satisfaction except in cases of mala fide or lack of material.

#### **Issues for Adjudication**

1. **Whether the President's Proclamation under Article 356 dissolving the Uttar Desh Legislative Assembly is justiciable.**
2. **Whether the Governor was bound to order a floor test before recommending President's Rule.**
3. **Whether imposition of President's Rule in Uttar Desh violates the principles of federalism and democracy, which form part of the basic structure.**
4. **Whether the dissolution of an elected Assembly without giving it an opportunity to prove majority is unconstitutional.**

#### **Jurisdiction**

- The case is filed directly before the **Supreme Court of India under Article 32**, alleging violation of fundamental rights and misuse of Article 356.

## **Moot Proposition 4 (Roll Number 37-48)**

### **Background Story**

In June 2026, the leading national daily **The Truth Times** published a series of investigative reports alleging widespread corruption in the higher judiciary of the Republic of Indica. The articles claimed that several sitting High Court judges had accepted “hospitality benefits” from corporate houses in exchange for favorable judgments.

The reports were authored by veteran journalist **Ms. Radhika Sen**, who has a long history of writing on judicial accountability. The articles relied on leaked documents, confidential sources, and testimonies of retired court staff.

Following the publication, public outrage spread across the country. Debates erupted on news channels questioning the credibility of the judiciary. In response, the **Registrar General of the Supreme Court of Indica** filed a **suo motu contempt petition** against Ms. Radhika Sen and The Truth Times, alleging that the articles scandalized the authority of the judiciary and lowered public confidence in the administration of justice.

### **Events and Dialogues**

At a public debate on national television, Ms. Sen defended her articles:

**Radhika Sen:** “The Constitution gives me the right to freedom of speech under Article 19(1)(a). Criticizing judges is not contempt of court—it is a democratic necessity. The people have the right to know how justice is being delivered.”

At a press briefing, the Attorney General of Indica remarked:

**Attorney General:** “While freedom of the press is sacrosanct, unfounded allegations against judges cannot be tolerated. If public faith in the judiciary collapses, democracy itself collapses. This is why contempt powers under Articles 129 and 215 exist.”

Civil society organizations issued statements supporting Sen, while bar associations called her reporting “reckless and damaging.”

### **Facts in Issue**

1. **The Truth Times** published investigative reports alleging corruption in the higher judiciary.
2. The Supreme Court initiated **suo motu contempt proceedings** against the journalist and the newspaper.
3. Ms. Radhika Sen contends that her right to free speech and press freedom under **Article 19(1)(a)** is being violated.
4. The Court maintains that its powers of contempt under **Articles 129 and 215** cannot be curtailed, as they safeguard judicial authority.

### **Arguments of the Petitioners (Radhika Sen & The Truth Times)**

- **Freedom of Speech:** Article 19(1)(a) guarantees the right to free speech and expression, including criticism of institutions.
- **Reasonable Restrictions:** While Article 19(2) allows restrictions in the interest of contempt of court, such restrictions must be narrowly construed.
- **Public Interest:** Exposing judicial corruption is a matter of public interest and cannot be punished as contempt.
- **Transparency & Democracy:** Judicial accountability is part of democracy. Silencing journalists undermines the principle of **open justice**.
- **International Standards:** Global human rights instruments protect journalistic criticism of public institutions.

### **Arguments of the Respondents (Supreme Court / Union of India)**

- **Contempt Jurisdiction:** Articles 129 and 215 empower courts to punish for contempt to maintain authority and ensure justice.
- **Public Confidence:** Scandalizing the court lowers public confidence in the judiciary and threatens the rule of law.
- **Limits of Free Speech:** Article 19(1)(a) is subject to Article 19(2). Contempt is an expressly recognized ground for restricting speech.
- **Unverified Allegations:** The reports relied on unverified documents and anonymous sources, amounting to reckless journalism.
- **Judicial Independence:** Baseless attacks erode the independence of the judiciary, which is part of the basic structure.

### **Issues for Adjudication**

1. **Whether criticism of the judiciary falls within the ambit of free speech under Article 19(1)(a).**
2. **Whether the contempt powers under Articles 129 and 215 override freedom of speech.**
3. **Whether investigative journalism exposing judicial corruption can be punished as contempt of court.**
4. **Whether judicial independence and authority justify restricting press freedom in cases of alleged contempt.**

### **Jurisdiction**

- The case is being heard by the **Supreme Court of India** under its **suo motu contempt jurisdiction (Articles 129 & 142)**.
